<u>The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny</u> – Happy Fourth of July! Now that summertime is completely upon us, attention also turns to warm weather pests – like mosquitos. Discovery of the ZIKA virus in North America has prompted a lot of discussion, and sometimes fear, as more information about the disease, how it is spread, and potentially serious health consequences, becomes available from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). What's the likelihood of ZIKA in my neighborhood? How can I protect my family from ZIKA? What else do I need to know?

In conjunction with the Fairfax County Health Department, I am hosting a **ZIKA Information Town Hall** meeting on **Monday**, **July 18**, **at 7:30 p.m.**, at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. Representatives from the Health Department will be available to discuss ZIKA, what is known about the virus, and what you can do to prevent it, and other mosquito-borne diseases. I hope you will plan to attend the **ZIKA Town Hall on July 18**.

Come a bit early, and enjoy the gallery show of oils and watercolors by local artists Bill and Stephanie Firestone, and Stephanie's late father, Peter Haikalis. The art show is presented by the Art in the Mason District Governmental Center program, which features talented local artists in a variety of mediums. Regular hours are 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Next year's art shows (each show is up for about three months in duration) are being planned now, so please notify my office if you, or someone you know, would like to be considered for participation.

<u>Temporary Relocation of the Bailey's Community Shelter</u> – The Planning Commission is scheduled to hold a public hearing on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 20</u>, <u>2016</u>, regarding the 2232 application for the proposed temporary relocation of the Bailey's Community Shelter. The 2232 application proposes moving the shelter to a temporary location in an area adjacent to the Lincolnia Senior Center on North Chambliss Street. The existing shelter must be relocated in advance of the redevelopment of a property known as the Southeast Quadrant in Bailey's Crossroads. In the meantime, the search for a permanent site for a new shelter continues.

<u>ULI Technical Assistance Panel to Develop Revitalization Strategies for Annandale</u> – The Fairfax County Office of Community Revitalization (OCR) is sponsoring a study of the Annandale Commercial Revitalization District (CRD) with a concentration on the "downtown" core along Columbia Pike. A mix of industry experts (urban designers, planners, real estate professionals, etc.) from the Urban Land Institute (ULI) Washington Chapter will convene a Technical Assistance Panel (TAP) for Annandale on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 20</u> and <u>Thursday</u>, <u>July 21</u> to discuss potential strategies, and <u>present their recommendations to the public at 5 p.m.</u> on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>July 21</u>, <u>2016</u>. The TAP will provide short- to medium-term revitalization strategies that concentrate on the appearance, economic vitality, and awareness/promotion of Annandale. Prior to the TAP meeting, Fairfax OCR is interested in hearing from the community about their experience in Annandale, and receiving their ideas about the CRD's future enhancement.
