A few items of information for you or your association newsletter:

The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny — When February winds blow, you know it's time for County Executive Ed Long to release his proposed county budget for Fiscal Year 2018. This year, his presentation coincides with Valentine's Day, but there probably won't be a lot of love in the numbers. Preliminary forecasts indicate that residential property values are flat, commercial property values are up slightly, and the needs for county services and programs continue to increase. Balancing revenues and expenditures, and keeping in mind the financial burden on our residential taxpayers, remains the challenge facing the Board of Supervisors and our constituents.

Important budget dates to keep in mind are:

Tuesday, February 14 – Budget presentation and release Tuesday, February 21 – Board's budget committee meets at 1 p.m.

Tuesday, March 7 – Board's budget committee meets at 1 p.m.
Thursday, March 9 – Mason District Budget Town Meeting at 7 p.m.
Tuesday, March 21 – Board's budget committee meets at 1 p.m.
Tuesday, March 28 – Board's budget committee meets at 1 p.m.
Tuesday, April 4 – Budget Public Hearings begin (around 6 p.m.)
Wednesday, April 5 – Budget Public Hearings continue at 1 p.m.
Thursday, April 6 – Budget Public Hearings continue at 1 p.m.
Tuesday, April 25 – Budget mark-up by the Board
Tuesday, May 2 – Board votes to adopt revised budget
Saturday, July 1 – FY18 revised budget becomes effective.

The March 9 Mason District Budget Town Meeting will be held at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. The other meetings listed will take place at the Fairfax County Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway, in Fairfax. All meetings are open to the public. The proposed budget will be posted on line at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dmb following the presentation on February 14. Copies also will be available for review at each Supervisor's office and Fairfax County Public Libraries.

<u>AARP Tax Aide Returns to Mason District in February!</u> – Free tax assistance will be available beginning Wednesday, February 1, 2017, thanks to AARP volunteers, who will be at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. AARP volunteers will provide walk-in service from February 1 through April 18: Mondays and Thursdays from 1 to 8 p.m.; Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 9:30 a.m. until 1 p.m.; Saturdays from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. Please note that walk-in hours will be closed on

President's Day, Monday, February 20, 2017. All returns are filed electronically. Because Emancipation Day (April 16) is a holiday in the District of Columbia and will be observed on Monday, April 17, the deadline for federal taxes this year is Tuesday, April 18. File Virginia taxes before the deadline on Monday, May 1. Remember to bring documents, such as last year's tax return, a photo ID, and Social Security cards for taxpayers and all dependents. Residents with illnesses or infirmities, which confine them to their homes, may schedule appointments with AARP for tax preparation services by calling 703-594-6576. Senior Citizen Tax Relief 2017 Workshops Coming to the Mason District Governmental Center – Supervisor Penny Gross, in collaboration with the Department of Tax Administration (DTA), is hosting free tax relief workshops on March 8 and 10, 2017, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon both days, at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. DTA staff will be on-site to assist residents with completing the 2017 Tax Relief application form and answer questions. No appointment is necessary. Bring your 2016 tax returns or proof of 2016 gross income from all sources, and all asset information as of December 31, 2016. Real estate tax relief is available for older adults and people with disabilities who meet certain qualifications. Qualified residents also may be eligible for car tax and rent relief. Alternatives for Bagging Yard Waste – Plastic bags are made from non-renewable resources, are not compostable, and require additional processing. Eliminating plastic bags for yard waste collection helps ensure all local yard composting facilities make the highest-quality end-products for use on residential and commercial lawns and gardens. When packaging yard waste for collection at the curb, consider the use of paper lawn and leaf bags or a reusable container. Paper lawn and leaf bags are made from a renewable resource, use less energy to produce, break down naturally when composted, reduce the cost of processing the material, and they are a more sustainable alternative to plastic. Yard waste also can be taken to the I-66 transfer station or the I-95 landfill complex. All dogs must be on leashes, and cats and ferrets must be in carriers. Vaccination cost is \$15 per pet. Fairfax County 2017 dog licenses will be sold separately and cost \$10. Cash and checks only will be accepted for payment at the clinic.
