A few items of information for you or your association newsletter:

<u>The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny</u> – Graduations, Father's Day, the start of summer, and family vacations mark June as a transition time for many Mason District residents. Life dials back a bit and schedules may be less intense, replaced by leisure activities and more personal time with friends and family.

Public safety never takes a break, and neither do emergencies. In Fairfax County, police and fire and rescue schedules continue to be 24/7; a call to 911 or the non-emergency number, 703-691-2131, will get a quick response, regardless of the season. With longer evenings, more pedestrians may be out and about, so drivers should exercise even more caution on neighborhood streets, where the speed limit almost always is 25 mph. Summertime also means more outdoor cooking. Be sure to check your barbecue or grill before each use, to ensure that hose connections are sound, and the grilling area is away from flammable materials and surfaces. An unattended grill on a wooden deck is a recipe for disaster! Don't forget a hat and sunscreen on sunny days, and stay hydrated. A few simple steps can make outdoor activities fun, without lights and sirens!

Summertime also means thunderstorms and the occasional hurricane or flash flood, with potential power outages. A little time spent now to prepare your household ensures that you can handle any summertime excitement that comes along.

<u>Community Forum about Immigration</u> – On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 3</u>, <u>2017</u>, from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. at the Luther Jackson Middle School Auditorium, 3020 Gallows Road in Falls Church, Fairfax County Government, in partnership with WZDC Telemundo Washington D.C., will cohost a panel discussion about immigration in Fairfax County. #### **Mason District Land Use Updates**

- Bailey's Shelter Relocation: In early fall 2016, Fairfax County purchased the property at 5914 Seminary Road in Falls Church, which housed the former Fairfax Animal Hospital. This site will be developed as the new location for the Bailey's Crossroads Community Shelter and Supportive Housing for adults. The facility is expected to be approximately 20,000 square feet, and to be completed by late 2019. - Plan Amendment 2017-I-B1: In January 2017, the Board of Supervisors authorized the consideration of a Comprehensive Plan amendment for 6060 Arlington Boulevard in

Falls Church, near the Arlington County border. The site currently is developed with a 32,000 square foot medical office building. The Board requested that staff consider redevelopment of the property from office use to residential use up to approximately 12 dwelling units per acre. - **SPA Forest**: C.Castle Group is proposing to repurpose the 145,255 square foot office building at **6432 General Green Way**, into a high-end spa concept called SPA Forest. In addition to the spa, the building will include several floors of pools, a children's play area, saunas, and a restaurant.
- Columbia Crossroads: Columbia Crossroads LP is seeking to rezone the property at Columbia Pike and Moncure Avenue in Falls Church for a Conceptual Development Plan consisting of a six-story, 370 unit multi-family residential building and four to six townhomes. More information about the plans will be available this summer.

<u>Hurricane Season Is Here: Are You Ready?</u> – June 1 is the official start of the Atlantic hurricane season, with the peak season from mid-August to late October, ending on November 30. Update emergency plans, refresh supplies, and be ready should a tropical storm affect our region. The Fairfax County Office of Emergency Management is responsible for coordinating preparedness, response, and recovery efforts for significant emergency events that may occur in our community.
