A few items of information for you or your association newsletter:

The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny – Autumn is upon us, a bit wetter so far this year. Fallen acorns seem to abound, providing a winter stash of food for squirrels and other wildlife, but also potentially treacherous underfoot for pedestrians. As daylight shortens during this time of year, it's not just acorns that pose problems. The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) has repaved many roads in Mason District this season, but rainy weather has prevented repainting of some lane markers and other safety features. Please be very careful when traversing unmarked areas. Eight pedestrians have been killed in Fairfax County so far this year, including two in Mason District. Using the crosswalk saves lives. Wearing light-colored clothing as a pedestrian at night saves lives. Slowing down saves lives. Let's not lose anyone else to another traffic accident.

The excessive rain also resulted in massive overgrowth of vegetation on VDOT medians, but also on private properties that abut walkways and intersections. That overgrowth can create sight distance issues for drivers, and prevent access to the walkway, forcing pedestrians to walk on the street. Homeowners are asked to check their properties, and trim back any offending bushes, shrubs, and low-hanging or protruding tree branches.

Election Day for Congressional seats is **Tuesday**, **November 6**, and there is information in this newsletter about registration deadlines and in-person absentee voting at the Mason District Governmental Center and other satellite locations. Voting is a basic right, and responsibility, of citizenship, protected and defended for more than two centuries. Please be sure to vote!

Is Your Voter Registration Current? – If you have had a change in name or address, you may update your voter registration at the Virginia Department of Elections

website: <u>https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation</u>. You are eligible to register to vote if you are: a citizen of the United States; at least 18 years of age by the next general election; and a resident of Virginia. **To vote in the November 6, 2018 General Election, you must be registered by the October 15 deadline.** Registration is available online at the Virginia Department of Elections website or in-person at the Fairfax County Office of Elections. Office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., and Thursday, 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. Please note that office hours are extended for statutory deadlines. - November 3: Deadline for In-Person Absentee Voting, 5 p.m.
- November 6: Absentee Ballot return deadline, 7 p.m.

In-person absentee voting at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale, will be available beginning Saturday, October 13 through Saturday, November 3, 2018. Voting times on Saturdays are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and weekdays from 3 to 7 p.m. No voting on Sundays, or on Monday, October 8 in observance of Columbus Day. Dispose of Unused and Expired Medications – On **Saturday, October 27, 2018**, from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m., the Fairfax County Police Department, in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration Diversion Control Division, will accept unused and expired medications for proper disposal. Stations serving Mason District include: Mason District Station, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale; Franconia District Station, 6121 Franconia Road in Alexandria; and West **Springfield District Station**, 6140 Rolling Road in Springfield. **Only prescriptions in liquid or pill form may be dropped off. No needles or pressurized canisters will be accepted.** Disposal is free,

<u>Columbia Pike Pedestrian and Bicycle Study</u> <u>Completed</u> – Fairfax County completed a comprehensive pedestrian and bicycle transportation study of Columbia Pike, from Little River Turnpike in Annandale to the Arlington County border in Bailey's Crossroads, to assess existing conditions and propose near-term and long-term improvements for connectivity and quality of bicycle and pedestrian facilities, and improved roadway crossings. The study was sponsored by the Metropolitan Council of Governments on behalf of Fairfax County through the Transportation-Land Use Connections Program, in coordination with the Fairfax County Office of Community Revitalization. <u>Support for Local Businesses' Hazardous Waste Management</u> – Many businesses generate small quantities of hazardous waste, which are subject to strict rules regarding disposal. Fairfax County provides a safe, legal, and affordable way to properly dispose of hazardous materials. Previously known as the Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator program (CESQG), this program was renamed the Very Small Quantity Generator program, or VSQG. Fairfax County's Solid Waste Management Program will host its next VSQG hazardous waste disposal event, for qualifying Fairfax County businesses, on Wednesday, November 14, 2018</u>. Details about sign-up, participation, proper storage, and disposal of hazardous waste is available at the Department of Public Works and Environmental Services website, www.fairfaxcounty.gov/publicworks/recycling-trash/very-small-quantity-generators,

or call Daniel Brooks at 703-342-6361. Enrollment in VSQG is free, and the program may be used as needed with only a small fee for the hazardous waste being disposed.

<u>Oil Paintings and Pencil Drawings Featured at Mason District Governmental Center</u> – The Art featured in the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale, is a collection of oil paintings by Loft Gallery artist and Springfield Art Guild member Lydia Jechorek. Lydia's subject matter is eclectic, with people looking at art in museums, city streets, and old cars she discovered abandoned on the sides of roads. Also on display are portrait drawings by students in an Inmate Reentry Program at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Under the volunteer instruction of Kelli Schollard-Sincock, students worked from provided photographs, and used a step-by-step pencil drawing process with a gridding system to teach the basics of observation and interpretation. The artwork is on display in the lobby until **Tuesday, October 31, 2018**.
