Fairfax County's Hypothermia Prevention Program Begins December 1 – Because of the successful public-private partnerships that serve the critical needs of chronically homeless persons, the 2017-2018 Fairfax-Falls Church emergency hypothermia shelters are open under a "no turn-away" status from now **until March 31, 2018** at all [emergency shelters](#) (www.fairfaxcounty.gov/homeless/hypothermia-prevention/emergency-shelter.htm), based on

freezing temperatures. If you see someone at night who is unsheltered and could be at risk of hypothermia, call the county's non-emergency phone line at 703-691-2131 (TTY 711). Lincolnia Planning District Study Continues in 2018 – Public hearing dates for the study are scheduled for early next year. Staff and task force recommendations will be shared before the Planning Commission on **Wednesday, January 24, 2018** at 7:30 p.m., and before the Board of Supervisors on **Tuesday, March 6, 2018** at 4 p.m. The public hearings will conclude Phase II of the long-range planning study of the Lincolnia area. The study will continue to review potential changes to Comprehensive Plan guidance (Plan Amendment 2013-I-L1) for the Lincolnia Planning District into Phase III, beginning early spring 2018. Volunteer Drivers Needed – The Shepherd's Center of Annandale - Springfield, a nonprofit seniors helping seniors organization, needs volunteer drivers to take area adults ages 50 and older to medical, dental, and physical therapy facilities during the week, and shopping and banking on weekends. The demand for this service is increasing, and new drivers are welcome and needed. VDOT is Ready for Snow this Winter – The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is ready for snow season with plow-tracking technology, expanded monitor program, and a one-

stop shop for online resources that is available for residents to use. VDOT has budgeted \$84.9 million for snow removal in Northern Virginia this winter, and the agency's state and contracted fleet is ready with 120,000 tons of salt; 250,000 gallons of brine; 25,000 tons of sand; and 4,500 vehicles (97 percent of fleet is contracted).

Highlights for Snow Season 2017-2018

- **One stop-shop for resources:** Visit www.virginiadot.org/novaemergency to access all of VDOT's online information resources, including important messages and updates, news releases, and links to the [customer service center](#), [511](#), and vdotplows.org.
- **Monitor program:** This year, 180 VDOT employees will ride the roads to monitor road conditions and snowplow progress, and more than 30 employees will monitor remotely via the automatic vehicle locator (AVL) equipment.

How You Can Help and Resources:

- Monitor forecasts frequently;
- Adjust commutes, telework, and avoid driving if possible;
- Park in driveways or park on the odd-numbered side of the street.
- Do not shovel driveway until plows have come through;
- Have enough gas, wiper fluid, proper tires, medication, and an emergency car kit;
- Be patient: crews need time and room to work.

If the item(s) can be set out, you may be required to schedule a pick up for it to be hauled away. To learn more, visit www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpwes/recycling/intro-where.htm. Mason Matters! The Television Show – As preparations for festivities are underway, the holiday season also is a time when trusting individuals fall prey to scam artists. Scam artists target their victims in all age groups, year-round and in many ways, and they often focus on individuals whom they perceive as vulnerable – our senior citizens. During a one-year study, the Federal Trade Commission estimated that, nationwide, 11 percent of adults, or 25 million people, lost money as a result of criminal activity. Protection from scam artists begins with education, which is why the Silver Shield Anti-Scam Campaign was launched – to educate older adults, families of senior citizens, caregivers, and the public about how to protect themselves from financial fraud and various scams, and to enhance personal safety and security.
