## **COMMON SENSE REMINDERS & OTHER THINGS**

This is the time of year when we must be vigilant in maintaining our community and looking out for each other, especially as it gets darker earlier. In being a good neighbor, keep the following in mind:

- 1. Please turn on your front and back lights at dusk. It can be very dark in our community, even with our street lights.
- 2. When walking your pet please clean up after your pet and pick up the poop. Be courteous to your neighbors, and be responsible for your pet so that your neighbors don't have to.
- 3. Please remember to take in your recycling bins and trash cans in a timely manner. Please be mindful of when you're putting out your trash and recyclables- if you see that the pick-up has already been made, please wait to put your trash out until the next scheduled pick-up. These items, when left unattended, look unsightly and take away from the beauty in our community.
- 4. Please keep tricycles, bikes, toys, etc. stored in back yards.
- 5. Remember, as our common areas are for everyone to enjoy, be mindful of dumping leaves and other refuse in them. Please do NOT sweep leaves from your front yard into the street. This can cause a hazard for your neighbors and those driving through the community. Injury from wet leaves is no joking matter.

### **SPEAKING OF UPKEEP...**

New signs were recently installed around the community. The large entry sign at Leestone Street and Backlick Road was replaced with a more up-to-date sign that fits into the colonial theme of our community. Landscaping was completed and we are looking into a spotlight to make the sign more noticeable at night. The four smaller signs around the community entrances were also replaced.

In addition, new message boards have been installed at mailbox stands to hold notices for the community. The new stands are more durable and will keep notices from getting wet or blowing away in bad weather.

## WINTER IS COMING

The winter months are right around the corner and now is a good time for residents to check out their homes to ensure essential repairs are not needed.

- ✓ Minor paint peeling, dangling shutters, deteriorating roofs, damaged gutters and downspouts may be made worse by severe winter weather and can cause extensive damage to homes.
- ✓ HVAC check-ups should be done to make sure your units are working properly.
- ✓ Remember to turn off outside faucets to avoid freezing pipes and damage to your home.
- ✓ Now is also a good time to start cleaning out planting beds. This not only gives you a jump on spring cleaning, but also avoids a dreaded ARC letter.
- ✓ Remember if you want to make any changes in your paint colors, doors, etc. you must get approval from the Architectural Review Committee before proceeding.

### **LEAVES AND SNOW**

The Grounds and Maintenance Company will perform two leaf removals in the fall, the first of which is likely to occur in November. Please keep in mind that cleaning leaves out of your planting beds is your responsibility and the Grounds and Maintenance crew will not clean them.

A snow removal contract is in place for the coming winter. Hopefully we will not need to use them very much (or at all!) this winter. When we do get snow, please be mindful of your surroundings and do not shovel snow into the street or behind your neighbors' cars. Please shovel the snow to your front lawn or the

#### Christmas Day & New Year's Day

No trash pickup will be provided. Our regular trash service is on December 25<sup>th</sup> and January 1st. The next pickup will be the Tuesdays after these holidays (December 29 and January 5). Recycling will be picked up on its regularly scheduled day (Tuesday). OUT OF CONSIDERATION FOR YOUR NEIGHBORS, PLEASE DO NOT PUT TRASH OUT ON CHRISTMAS OR NEW YEAR'S DAY.

#### Yard Debris Collection

Ends effective December 4<sup>th</sup> and will resume March 1st. If you have yard debris to be collected after this date, place your items at curbside on Fridays until yard debris season resumes the first week of March.

#### Christmas Tree Collection

Christmas trees will be collected on January 6<sup>th</sup> and January 13<sup>th</sup>. Please remove all tinsel and decorations. Please do NOT place trees in plastic bags.

#### **Inclement Weather**

Safety is a primary concern. Roads and/or areas which the trash contractor deems to be unsafe due to snow or ice will NOT be provided service. If suspension occurs, services will resume on the next <u>REGULARLY</u> scheduled collection day. While we cannot predict ahead of time winter driving conditions, please use common sense and refrain from putting trash out if dangerous icy conditions or moderate snow conditions are forecast.
