WHEN: Saturday, May 19, 2012

WHERE: Initial gathering at Corner of Leebrad Street and Leestone Court

LET'S NOT TALK TRASH!

This year's Spring in Leewood arrived with gorgeous blooms on trees and flowers and an abundance of green grass (and yes, pollen) in our community. Not only is the upkeep of our homes imperative but our Leewood common area is one of our greatest assets, providing a grand selling point for our community and needs to be maintained as well.

A few tips to make a huge impact on keeping Leewood in pristine shape:

- Let's **work together** to keep trash and debris from all the common areas- this does include our streets.
 - If you notice trash as you walk through Leewood, don't hesitate to bend down, pick it up and dispose of it with your trash.
 - As the various trees and other plantings shed their spring blooms it accumulates in the streets.
 As homeowners, consider spending a few moments **sweeping** the **gutters** and parking areas in front of your homes. Such a small task greatly contributes to keeping Leewood looking beautiful.
- It is nice to be able to report that we have noticed less pet deposits in our common areas.
 - Unfortunately, we have also noticed that some pet owners who do pick up after their dogs, have been disposing of the bags on the common area peninsulas.
 - Regrettably, there is a not pet patrol that goes around picking up after these discarded bags.
 Please dispose of the bags in your own waste disposal containers.
- As we all continue to clean up in our planting beds and raking the leaves and other debris in our yards please remember:
 - Don't dispose of debris in the common areas; pick it up and bag it for the Friday garbage pickup days. This includes <u>not</u> raking or sweeping the debris to the peninsula in the common area, into the streets, or a parking space or even to a neighbor's yard.
 - Our grounds contractor is not scheduled to do leaf pickups until the Fall, so let's pitch in and clean up what still remains.
- A final reminder Weekly Trash Pickup
 - Please put your trash out at <u>dusk or later</u> the day before trash pick-up BUT **not** anytime before!
 - Remember to move your trash & recycle containers to your backyards once the trash has been picked up.
 - Containers that are not removed by dusk on the day of trash pickup risk being confiscated and removed permanently.

We hope everyone ENJOYS the nice weather and our community common areas.

There was also a discussion about homeowners that own multiple vehicles and basically store them in the community and what could be done about the situation.

The president talked about the accomplishments of the board the past year which included paving and milling and crack sealing on Leestone Street and Bradgen Court, reinstalling speed bumps, installation of a French drain. The president thanked Al Carchedi for all of his hard work over the years and announced that he's retiring.
